This conference is part of a series for world language teachers, co-sponsored by the Penn Lauder CIBER Program and the Graduate School of Education at the University of Pennsylvania.

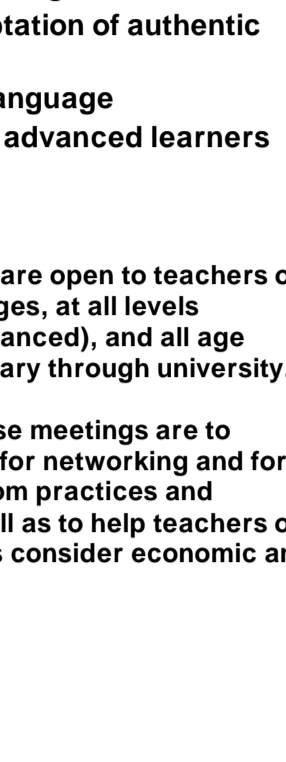

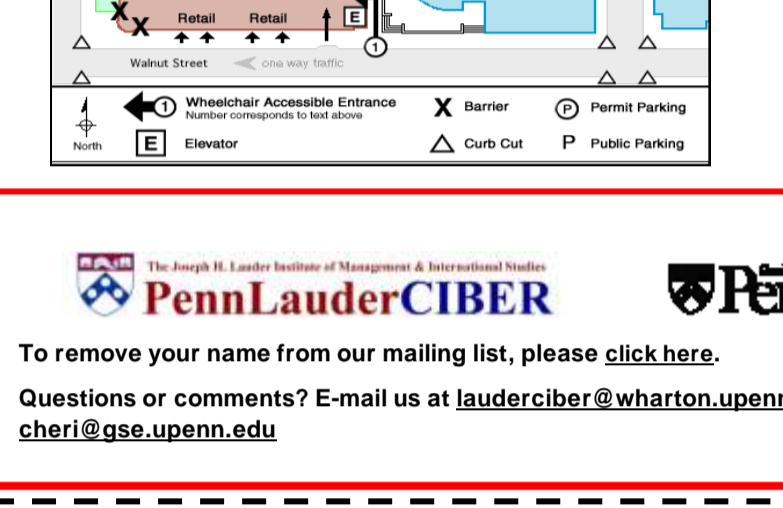
These meetings are open to teachers of all world languages, at all levels (beginner to advanced), and all age groups, elementary through university.

Our goals in these meetings are to provide a forum for networking and for sharing classroom practices and concerns, as well as to help teachers of world languages consider economic and business topics.

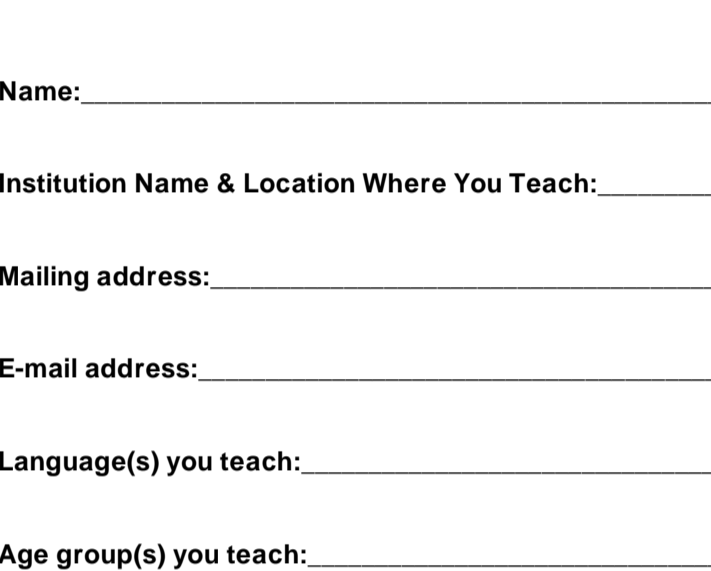
